

Moving Vehicle Parking Code

Under University of Miami's Moving Vehicle Parking Code Chapter 6 subsection 6.01:

Any person who operates or parks a vehicle on the campus shall comply with local municipal, State of Florida, and University of Miami rules and policies, including but not limited to all stop signs, yellow or white lines for routing traffic, speed limit signs, **one-way street signs**, and traffic lights or signals.



Properly certified drivers are responsible for knowing and obeying the rules of the road.

Violators of said policy will be issued a traffic citation.

ONE-WAY TRAFFIC SAFETY

One-Way Streets

One-way streets are designated to have the traffic flow in one direction, usually to alleviate congestion and have a more efficient manner of moving traffic.



NEVER drive against traffic on designated one-way streets.

It is illegal to do so and can result in traffic accidents!

On Campus

The University of Miami's Coral Gables campus has a one-way street and several one-way entrances and exits of parking lots. The one-way street on campus is a section of Dickinson Drive southeast of the Perez Architectural Center between buildings 49 and La Gorce House.

This one-way street is also travelled by the Canes Shuttle Bus (Dickinson), so it is a highly trafficked road that drivers must use caution while using.

Dangers of Going Against Traffic



Ignoring posted signs for one-way traffic flow can lead to serious injury. The best safety tip to follow is to observe posted signs and perform proper operations when operating a moving vehicle.



Typical one-way streets have multiple lanes in them. If there are pre-designated lanes for turning or

continuing forward, they must be followed. Minor accidents occur frequently on one-way streets due to improper lane change.

Be mindful of your place on the road and those around you!

One-Way Street Parking

It is legal to park along one-way streets as long as you are parked:

Properly -

- In the direction of the flow of traffic
- There are designated parking spaces



Always use caution while driving on the road.
