- Operating 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, the University of Miami Police Department is composed of a highly-dedicated team of State of Florida certified and sworn police officers 305-284-6666
- The department also employs several support professionals, including a Crime Prevention Specialist, Security Manager, Communication Operators, and a Data Custodian
- University police officers conduct continuous patrols, respond to all emergency calls on campus, take police reports, provide safety information, and actively participate in proactive crime prevention efforts




SAFETY ESCORTS & SAFE RIDE

- Safety escort services are 24/7, 365 days a year by calling 305-284-6666
- A UM security officer will walk with you to your destination
- Safety escorts only cover campus property
- All security officials carry a radio and are in constant contact with UMPD
- Safe Ride operates Monday Friday
 10:00pm to 3:00am. Call (305) 769-6065
 for a ride.
- Safe Ride will pick up/drop off on campus

- Works on all IOS and Android Devices
- Download "Rave Guardian" FREE in the app store
- Use UM email to register
- E911 (Enhanced 911 capability) add only the info you want to add
- UMPD and emergency call button
- Safety timer function



BICYCLE REGISTRATION PROGRAM





- You can register your bicycle online at umpd.miami.edu and clicking the "Register Your Bicycle Button"
- After registering online head on over to UMPD to claim your **FREE** U-Lock.
- Abandoned bicycles will be tagged and then impounded by UMPD after 14 days of notice.
- Impounded bicycles which are unclaimed after 90 days will be donated.
- Security will lock up all unregistered, unsecured, or improperly secured bicycles on campus.



CRIME ON CAMPUS

- Most crimes on campus are crimes of opportunity
- Thefts account for 50% 80% of all campus crime
- Never leave valuables unattended or unsecured, not even for a minute
- Put valuables in the trunk, not on the seats.
- Label, engrave or mark your personal items in an identifiable way to link the object back to you, should it ever be recovered
- Do not prop open or disengage the locking system on doors.

STAYING OUT OF TROUBLE

Underage Drinking: Florida State Statue 562.111:

States that it is unlawful for any person under the age of 21 years to have in her or his possession alcoholic beverages

Campus Weapons Policy Florida State Statue 790.115:

Florida state law prohibits possession of weapons on any school grounds, regardless of a permit. Firearms, knives, electric, and chemical weapons included.

Fake ID's Florida State Statue 322.212:

States that it is unlawful for anyone to knowingly possess or display any blank, forged, stolen, fictitious, counterfeit, or otherwise unlawfully issued driver's license or identification card.

SAFETY REMINDERS

Personal Safety In Your Car

- Always keep your car doors locked
- Don't accept a ride from a stranger
- Check the back seat before entering a car
- Have at least a quarter-tank of gas
- Do not leave valuables **visible** in your vehicle
- Always have a good spare tire and a jack
- If you break down, wait with your vehicle and call AAA or the police. Don't accept a ride with a stranger
- If you feel that you're being followed, drive toward a well-lit public area, preferably a place with many people

Personal Safety Away From Home

- Walk, exercise, and park in well-lit areas
- Carry your keys in hand so that you're ready to enter your car or building
- Be aware of your surroundings and the people around you
- Avoid ATMs in secluded or dark locations
- **Keep your space**. Be careful of strangers asking for directions or who try to engage you in conversation.
- If you observe anyone acting in a suspicious manner, or if you feel threatened in any way, call the police immediately by dialing 911
